## 2-6-1) The Ten Commandments of Faith

8. Thou Shalt not be afraid of persecution or of failure
9. Thou Shalt not be afraid of Man nor of demons.
10. Thou shalt not fret thyself nor fear of what to do or worry about God's guidance

3. Thou shalt create a workable plan.
