# 1-1-1) The Ten Commandments – Bible

Exodus 20:1-17 Deuteronomy 5:4-21

- 1 Thou shalt have no other gods before me
- 2 Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image
- 3 Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain
- 4 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy
- 5 Honor thy father and thy mother
- 6 Thou shalt not kill
- 7 Thou shalt not commit adultery
- 8 Thou shalt not steal
- 9 Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor
- 10 Thou shalt not covet (neighbor's house wife, servants, animals or anything)

## 1-1-2A) The Ten Commandments of Core Values quoted from Bible - 1

- 1) Thou shalt not compare yourself to the standards of the world, but to the standards of God's Word. "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things." Colossians 3:2
- 2) Thou shalt not allow ungodly relationships to negatively influence you. "Bad company corrupts good character." I Corinthians 15:33
- 3) Thou shalt not be influenced by the media. "See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of the world rather than on Christ." Colossians 2:8
- 4) Thou shalt not compromise your spiritual convictions and allow the devil to get a foothold on your life. "And do not give the devil a foothold." Ephesians 4:27
- 5) Thou shalt not make up excuses to justify wrong actions. "Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you." James 4:7

## 1-1-2B) The Ten Commandments of Core Values quoted from Bible - 2

- 6) Thou shalt allow your lifestyle to be a testimony to all people. “so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders.” I Thess. 4:12
- 7) Thou shalt exhibit the fruit of the Holy Spirit 24/7. “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.” Galatians 5:22, 23
- 8) Thou shalt create a legacy of faith for future generations. “They will be called oaks of righteousness. Their descendants will be known among the nations and their offspring among the peoples.” Is. 61:3b, 9
- 9) Thou shalt not take advantage of the grace of God. “If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for our sins is left.” Hebrews 10:26
- 10) Thou shalt raise up your standard of living through repentance and righteousness. “For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.” Romans 14:17

# 1-1-3) The Ten Commandments of Effective Spiritual Leadership

1. **Thou shalt model what you preach** - The most powerful leaders are those who walk in private what they preach in public
2. **Thou shalt develop leaders of leaders who can succeed you** – The leader need to start working themselves out of a job by empowering others to do what they are already doing.
3. **Thou shalt prioritize investing in people more than programs and marketing** - Our first priority should always be pouring into people.
4. **Thou shalt communicate a divine, compelling vision worth following** - If you do not have a compelling vision from God then other key leaders with potential will not follow you.
5. **Thou shalt learn to release others to help fulfill the vision** - The leader's vision must become a shared vision if it is to come to pass.
6. **Thou shalt hold yourself and your followers accountable** - leaders must have high standards of personal accountability when it comes to their walk with God.
7. **Thou shalt practice Matthew 18:15-17** - This has to do with walking in the light and in transparency with one another.
8. **Thou shalt affirm those who bear fruit and redeem those who fail** - Effective leaders learn to praise those who minister effectively and try to redeem those who are failing.
9. **Thou shalt hold to high standards of excellence and integrity in service** - every leader needs to hold high standards both for their own life, ministry and performance as well as those who are serving along with them.
10. **Thou shalt walk in wisdom and humility regarding the future** - All effective leaders must be able to see where their organization needs to go in the future based on demographic and cultural shifts.

# 1-1-4) The Ten Commandments of End-time suffering

Source: THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF SUFFERING FOR JESUS (1 Peter 4:7-19):

- (1) Do Be Serious And Watchful In Your Prayers (1 Peter 4:7). A sound, temperate mind (self-controlled) and not intoxicated by the wine of this world in their prayers.
- (2) Do Have Fervent Love For One Another (1 Peter 4:8).
- (3) Do Be Hospitable To One Another (1 Peter 4:9).
- (4) Do Minister To One Another (1 Peter 4:10-11). We must use the Spiritual Gifts we have received as good stewards of the grace of God , ministering to one another.
- (5) Don't Think It Strange Concerning The Fiery Trial (1 Peter 4:12). We are not to consider suffering for Jesus as foreign to us, but consider it as something to try (test, refine as through fire) us.
- (6) Do Rejoice To The Extent That You Partake Of Christ's Sufferings (1 Peter 4:13). We are to be calmly happy in sufferings as we are sharers with Christ in this truly noble cause.
- (7) Do Be Blessed (literally 'happy') If Reproached For The Name Of Christ (1 Peter 4:14). This clearly shows the common theme in this letter of God's glory coming after and during suffering for Him.
- (8) Don't Suffer As An Evildoer (1 Peter 4:15). This means that we are not to suffer because we deserve it (this is just punishment) but suffer for Christ when we don't deserve it.
- (9) Don't Be Ashamed For Suffering For Christ (1 Peter 4:16). Peter commands suffering Christians not to have the feeling of being ashamed because of this. Instead they are to glorify God in the midst of their trials.
- (10) Do Commit Your Soul To Him In Doing Good (1 Peter 4:19). We are to place alongside our souls in doing good. Creator knows the end from the beginning.
